The dinar, once stable at almost \$3.00 to every dinar, now trades at 2,500 dinars to the dollar. Families spend large proportions of their meager salaries on supplementing the insufficient United Nations food basket, which lasts about 20 days. (*From* report of Congressional Staff Delegation to Iraq.)

The average monthly wage in Iraq is \$5. The average monthly rent in Iraq is \$5. As a result, people are selling jewelry, carpets, furniture, books, clothing and toys, just to survive.

The Court commended the defendants on their citizenship, and told them, on the record, that he felt "moved by their concern, by their sincere belief, by their convictions."
